- Supporting the clinical fieldwork team to conduct their work;
- Conducting data analyses on topics agreed with the project's principal investigators:
- Co-managing relevant research grants, develop new grant applications, and ensure overall budgeting for the quantitative portion of the research project;
- Presentation of analyses at seminars, workshops and conferences, and
- Preparation of research findings for publication in peer-reviewed journals.
