What is the PPE?







Why the PPE?

PPE maximises the synergy between three disciplines (PHI, POL, ECO) which have a natural chemistry to help us solve the most pressing problems facing society...

- Philosophy trains us to critically question how we as humans acquire knowledge, the values which underpin this knowledge, and how that knowledge informs and justifies the actions that we take
- Politics equips us with the tools to decide how best to use our collective knowledge to solve shared problems and improve public welfare (through government institutions & policy)
- Economics reminds us that solving collective problems and improving our individual and collective welfare always entrails weighing up costs and benefits

Example: Energy security & climate change:

- PHI: What kind of relationship should humans have with the earth; do we have a set of moral obligations towards the earth; how do we as humans impact the earth – how do we know? How do we reconcile our obligations towards the earth with our obligations towards ourselves?
- POL: How do we engage in collective action (government, civil society) to reduce our impact on the earth and mitigate volatile and disruptive changes in weather? How best do we negotiate and create policies to achieve this? What obligations, if any, do nations have towards each other when managing the effects of climate change?
- ECO: What are the material costs and benefits to individuals and society of climate change, and in how we choose to react to it? How do we incentivize nations, individuals and businesses to reduce their impact on the earth, i.e. adapt our economic behaviour (e.g. what we consume, how we consume, where we consume, how we produce...)

Subject-specific options in the PPE

• <u>Philosophy</u>: 2nd and 3rd year courses include applied ethics, business ethics, political philosophy, philosophy of race, philosophy of psychology, philosophy of science and a course on the nature of reality and knowledge.

 Politics: offers various courses in 2nd & 3rd year covering political theory, public policy & administration, political economy, local government, global political institutions & the politics of Africa

 <u>Economics</u>: offers topical courses like development economics, and at third year a range of offerings like public sector economics, natural resource economics, history of economic thought, labour economics and international trade and finance
