# **SWAHILI COMMUNICATION**

#### What is Kiswahili?

Kiswahili is one of the most widely spoken languages in Africa, with over 350 million speakers across the continent. It is an official language in Tanzania, Kenya, and Uganda, and it serves as a lingua franca in several countries across the East African Community (EAC), including Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Burundi, Rwanda, Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Somalia, and South Sudan. Kiswahili has political significance and is also used by the African Union (AU) as an official language and Southern African Development Community (SADC) as a working language.

### **Course Overview**

UCT offers a structured Kiswahili program designed to take students from zero knowledge to advanced communication skills. Starting in 2025, students can enrol in first-year and second-year Swahili courses as part of their elective options.

- First-Year Courses (Beginner level, no prior knowledge required)
- Second-Year Courses (Requires completion of first-year courses or equivalent)

These courses are part of a VC Special Funding Project and will be available for online registration via the Blank Shopping Cart.

#### **Course Details**

#### First-Year Swahili Courses (No Prior Knowledge Required)

These courses introduce students to the basics of Kiswahili:

- Swahili Communication IA (SLL1017F) Learn Kiswahili from scratch.
- Swahili Communication IB (SLL1117S) Requires completion of SLL1017F or an equivalent course upon assessment by the course convenor.

Students are encouraged to enrol in first-year courses to ensure a smooth transition to second-year Swahili courses.

#### Second-Year Swahili Courses (Continuation from First Year)

To enrol in 2nd-year Swahili courses, students must complete the 1st-year courses or an equivalent course from another university (subject to assessment by the course convenor).

- Swahili Communication IIA (SLL2017F) Requires completion of SLL1017F and SLL1117F or equivalent.
- Swahili Communication IIB (SLL21117S) Continuation of IIA
