Pre-requisites

A Bachelor degree with French as a major and an appropriate academic level in English and French or the equivalent, at the discretion of the Head of Department

Semester 1: Research Methods /

Learning and Teaching / Initiation to Additional
Language Proficiency / Teaching Methodology and Class
Observation in French as a Foreign Language

Semester 2: French Linguistics / Teaching Methodology and Teaching Practice in French as a Foreign Language / Research Project

By the end of the Coursework Masters, you will have a more in-depth knowledge of the French-speaking world and you will be able to:

Set up and monitor courses in French for Special Purposes / Set up and monitor courses in French using Information and Communication Technologies /

Set up and monitor courses to train educators

Pre-requisites

BA Hons TFFL and a high academic level in English and French or the equivalent, at the discretion of the Head of Department

Course Content

Semester 1: Didactics for French as a Foreign Language / The French-speaking Wor(I)d: linguistics and Literature / Research Dissertation

Semester 2: Teaching French for Special Purposes / Language Teaching and Technologies / Research Dissertation

Please note that the BA Honours TFFL is offered as a face-to-face programme and the MA TFFL is offered as a distance learning programme. The MA can be completed over one or two years. Applicants should also indicate which timeframe they prefer.

BEFORE 15 OCTOBER

Applicants must submit the following documents:

Letter of motivation / Detailed curriculum vitae (including e-mail address, telephone number and computer skills) / Certified photocopies of study record and academic transcript / 2 reference letters in support of the application / Letter of application for a scholarship, if needed.
