Judith Chapman, when she transcribed, was new to the Company and did not recognise his voice and simply lists this as 'voice'.

Some of his recollections were in 'From Shtetl to Steelmaking' . Mr Mervish was not sought out as an interviewee - he was met by chance when Marian Robertson was doing research in the Jewish Museum. He was then close to or just past 80 years old.

"From Shtetl to Steelmaking". Final typed MS used by Editor, Mrs Phillida Simons, who also read, after Marian Robertson, the first proofs.

After editing, certain pages were retyped and inserted in this copy.

It was originally intended that three copies of the final typed MS should be used in Cape Town:

- 1. For the printer. (This copy is now with Cape Gate)
- Marian Robertson's copy a master copy, with editor's original amendments. Enclosed is this copy.
- 3. Copy for Marian Robertson to use to show to various members of the family who should see the final version of what was written about them or, in the instance of Solly Kaplan, how what they had written had been edited.

The master typed copy was photo-copied and then the master sent to Jo'burg for further copies to be made there. Unfortunately, the master copy of Part 1 went astray in the post, having been incorrectly addressed by a Trichtsteel employee, only turning up when the book was being printed. Marian Robertson now has copy 3 of the 145, including the master copy of Part 1. Her photocopy of this part was sent to Johannesburg when the other was lost.

Further amendments were made to the MS while proofs were being read.

- 12 Envelope (large) 1. Dustdacket. First colour proof plus original rough layout of Angus McBride. The rough layout was made in a few minutes while he and Marian Robertson discussed it and sent to client with the notes in file 3.
- 2. Dustjacket. Colour rough made for Struik. Finished art was returned to Cape Gate. Enclosed in the colour rough: Copy and some corrected proofs of captions, bibliograhy and index (latter includes items cut for space), rough layouts by Angus McBride for title page and memos on colour pages, showing how they were changed.
 - 3. Dustiacket. Final layout for printer.

4. Title page - Final layout. (Note: This idea was suggested by Marian Robertson and worked out between her, Allan Elion and Angus McBride -Struik had nothing to do with it and did not, originally, want it this way.)

Compliments slip - instructions, layout and proofs.

Map - Designed by Wim Reinders with instructions and material from Marian Robertson. References are photo-copied save for M.R.'s large Harmsworth Atlas, used for the outlines of the map and some place names.

6. Final page proofs with last minute corrections.

13. PAPER PACKET. First layout (typeset copy on squared paper) that was taken by Wim Reinders to Jo'burg to show to Mendel Kaplan and Allan Elion, plus revision of Part 4 with M.R.'s comments.

Colour proofs with captions. Some sheets of final proofs.

Note: Before this layout was shown to client, Marian Robertson was not able to read through the text - no time - and the compromise she and Wim Reinders arrived at for the acknowledgments was disapproved. There was insufficient space for it at the beginning and it was placed at the end. Finally part of it went at the start and the section 'Dates and Names' placed at the end.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Hilda Purwitsky was born in 1901 in the province of Kovno, Lithuania. She came as a baby to South Africa with her parents and the family lived in Cape Town, where her father worked as a blacksmith. She was educated at the Sacred Heart Convent in Somerset Road, Green Point and the Cape Town Training College.

In 1920, when a student teacher at the De Villiers Street School, she met Roza van Gelderen, a member of the staff and when Miss van Gelderen was appointed principal of the Girls' Central School, at that time in Buitenkant Street, Hilda Purwitsky also obtained a post there.

At about this time they both became friendly with Irma Stern, who had not yet made a name for herself in South Africa as a painter and sculptor and the three were close friends for over forty years. While teaching at the Girls' Central School, Miss Purwitsky attended evening lectures at the University of Cape Town and obtained her B.A. degree. Also at this time she was local correspondent for the S A Jewish Times, the Zionist Record, the S A Jewish Chronicle and Afrikaner Yiddische Zeitung, often writing articles in conjunction with Roza van Gelderen. After nearly twenty years at the school, they both left for posts in Johannesburg, but afterwards returned to Cape Town.

Miss Purwitsky continued her journalism and also travelled extensively, accumulating an interesting and valuable collection of historical material. She lives in Sea Point, Cape Town, and intends writing a history of the Girls' Central School.

THE COLLECTION

The Purwitsky Collection was donated to the University of Cape Town Libraries in 1981 by Miss Hilda Purwitsky through the Kaplan Centre for Jewish Studies and numbers 448 items.

Miss Purwitsky was a journalist, so a large part of the collection comprises interviews with and articles about prominent and interesting Jewish personalities during the years 1919 to 1979, everyday as well as important events in contemporary Jewish life and also early days in Southern Africa from the Jewish angle. The section on Jewish Benefactors to South Africa includes the 1850's to the 1930's. One of the most interesting parts of the collection deals with South African Jewish Art and artists, particularly the section on the painter Irma Stern (1894-1966). Hilda Purwitsky and Roza van Gelderen, who was headmistress of the Girls' Central School, Vredehoek,, were personal friends of Irma Stern and their biographical notes reveal interesting details of how this remarkable artist lived and worked.

Together, Hilda and Roza wrote many articles under the pseudonyms Rozilda, Hora, Zora Dailh, V G Purvis and Hillel Ross. Hilda Purwitsky also wrote under her own name, her initials H.P., and the pseudonyms Elia Stamm, Aleph Beth and Clara Way. She wrote mainly for the South African Jewish Times, the South African Jewish Chronicle, the Zionist Record and the Cape Times and regular articles appeared in columns headed "Out of the Ordinary", "The Human Angle" and "What shall I read?"

The collection is an enthusiastic record of Jewish affairs and personalities and Miss Purwitsky stresses the contribution made financially and the talents they showed in different fields by Jewish South Africans to the land of their adoption.

Wolf Miller was a founder member of the Strand-Somerset West Zionist Society in 1904 and was chairman of the Society for many years. He was President of the Somerset West Hebrew Congregation, and during his life also served on the local School Board and as president of the Chamber of Commerce.

In 1904, he was married to Mary Efroiken [Afroiken?], who came to South Africa from Lithuania in 1902. She died in 1954. They had five sons and one daughter.

SOUTH AFRICAN JEWISH BOARD OF DEPUTIES. CAPE COUNCIL BC 792

The South African Jewish Board of Deputies, the umbrella organisation of South African Jewry, is an amalgamation of the Jewish Board of Deputies of the Cape Colony (1904) and the Jewish Board of Deputies of the Transvaal and Natal (1905), that was established in 1912. An independent Cape Council was not constituted until 1952.

The main fields of activity of the S. A. Jewish Board of Deputies can be broadly divided into three main areas: the combatting of antisemitism through liason with the South African government and through building bridges with other faith communities; the organisation of Jewish cultural and educational programmes; and thirdly, keeping abreast of Holocaust-based claims and communicating them to survivors in the community..

The work of the South African Jewish Board of Deputies, Cape Council, incorporates all aspects of Jewish life, including Hebrew congregations, Jewish organisations (fraternal, professional, welfare and charitable), Jewish schools, and all Jewish related activities in the greater city of Cape Town as well as the wider Western, Eastern and Northern Cape provinces. The main body of records begin in the 1950s and end in the mid 1990s and in some cases in the early 2000s. However this collection is continually growing as more and more of the Board's records are archived.

The collection is divided into a number of broad areas that are listed below. Correspondence is divided into general, as well as Special topics; Minutes include the Cape, the National Executive of the Board of Deputies in Johannesburg, as well as other Councils (Transvaal, Pretoria, Natal, Eastern Province and the Orange Free State); Congresses are both local and interprovincial. Three sections of the collection are restricted: Public relations, Bursaries in the section on Welfare, and Reparation claims from Germany, in the section on Antisemitism.

The Story of the South African ORT-OZE

In late nineteenth century Russia, the majority of the Jews living under Tsarist rule were subjected to a range of political, economic and legal restrictions which contributed to conditions of abject poverty with seemingly no prospect of alleviation. Of the more than five million Russian Jews, all but 200,000 were forced to live in the Pale of Settlement stretching from the Baltic to the Crimea, lands which were primarily agrarian. Jews, however, were forbidden to acquire rural property of any kind and very few actually worked on the lands. The majority of Jews were forced to be itinerant peddlers or were limited to such crafts as shoemaking or tailoring.

In February 1880, a railroad builder named Samuel Poliakov, whose substantial contribution to Russian economic development earned him an ear in Tsarist circles, petitioned Tsar Alexander II asking for authority to create a fund to aid needy Jews. Permission for this was granted a month later and Poliakov's petition is regarded as the founding document of the "Obschestvo Remeslenovo i zemledelcheskovo Tronda" (translated and alliterated in English as the Organisation for Rehabilitation through Training) or ORT. ORT served to encourage the training of Jews in trades, crafts and agriculture, first in Russia and subsequently throughout the world and by the middle of the twentieth century, it had reputedly become the largest voluntary organisation in the world with its headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.

ORT was supplemented in 1912 by the establishment of the "Obshchestvo Zdravookhraneniia Evreev", or OZE, which translates into English as the "Society for the Protection of the Health of the Jews". OZE was formed with the object of improving the physical fitness of the Jewish people. Inherent in its focus on both curative and preventive efforts in combating sickness, it worked towards the prevention of epidemics and the creation of health-promoting living conditions. Expansion throughout Russia was extensive. After the first World War OZE centres were opened throughout Central and Western Europe and the headquarters were transferred to Berlin. After the second World War, OZE's activities extended still further into South America, Israel and Africa.

The South African ORT-OZE was established in Johannesburg in 1938 and within six years, Cape Town could boast its own ORT-OZE. There was no machinery at that stage for a national body enterprise and Cape Town ORT-OZE was expected to operate as an autonomous body until such a national body could be formed.

By 1944, SA ORT-OZE (Cape) had set up a Vocational Guidance Bureau in London and Lancashire House at 148 St George's Street and it was supported in this work by the South African Jewish Board of Deputies (Cape Committee) and the Union of Jewish Women (Cape Town Branch).

In the early 1970s, the South African ORT (Cape) divided into five chapters (later branches): Western Cape, ORT Atlantic, Southern, Bramson and Syngalowski whilst retaining a Cape Regional presence overseeing Cape operations. The bulk of the records in this collection emanate from the Western Cape Branch and the SA ORT-OZE (Cape) Region.

Sub-committees developed as needs demanded including the Building Industry Guild, Junior ORT, the Rosecourt Youth Centre, the Technical Sub-Committee, e the Women's Committee and the Johannesburg Women's ORT.

The mission of SA ORT-OZE, as of ORT internationally, has been to provide a training agency of the Jewish people, providing training in industrial skills and crafts as a means of assuring a life of economic security and dignity.

PHILIP SEGAL PAPERS

Philip Segal was born in Cape Town in 1915. He was educated at Hillel College and graduated from UCT in 1934 with an Arts degree. He subsequently attained a Masters degree at UCT in 1936, a Masters degree at the University College, London in 1939 and a B Ed at UCT in 1940.

In 1941 he became a temporary lecturer in English Literature at UCT and in 1946 - a permanent lecturer. 1946 was also the year in which he married. In 1956 he became a senior lecturer and then Acting Head of Department in 1961. He was appointed to the second chair of English at the University of the Witwatersrand in 1966. He died in December 1970 at the age of 55.

The collection includes personal Memorabilia in the form of school and degree certificates, curriculum vitae, letters of recommendation, photographs - including those of T S Elliot and Sidney Clouts, and several of Phillip Segal in different dramatic roles. Also included are newscuttings, some of which record his relationship with the 'Friends of Italy Association', correspondence from people such as Guy Butler, Sidney Clouts, and Maria Leveson, who edited the book 'Philip Segal essays and lectures', after his death. Lastly there are newscuttings and notes concerning the production of 'Authors Live' presented on 19 April 1970, copies of lectures and articles and one audiotape of his UCT Summerschool Lecture "The City in Literature".

The documents consist of the papers of Marian Robertson, second editor of the book, researcher for Mendel Kaplan and author or part-author of a number of the chapters. Other writers did their own research, but the general research done by Marian Robertson, particularly into papers of Jewish institutions, was passed on to them. In other instances she did special research for a writer. AS second editor, she also typed and did preliminary editing of all chapters, thus the entire manuscript in some of its many versions is with these documents. The book was typeset from the floppy disks. Mrs Phillida Simons was the textual editor; Mrs Tessa Kennedy was the professional proof-reader, Win Reinders and Associates produced the book – the publisher merely did the distribution. Marian Robertson was in overall control of the details of the production and acted as liaison between Mendel Kaplan, the writers and the production team. All the correspondence and most of the direct contact with the writers was through Marian Robertson. These papers therefore present the core of all the information about how the book was written.

THE COLLECTION

The papers contain correspondence, arranged in chronological order, concerning the formation and activities of the anti-Semitic Greyshirt Movement in Port Elizabeth in the years 1933 to 1939.

These activities culminated in a court case brought against the Greyshirts by Rev. A. Levy on a charge of defamation.

The court case dealt with the authenticity of a document, bearing the signature of the Rev. A Levy, which was allegedly stolen by the Greyshirts from the Western Rd. synagogue.

The outcome of the trial showed the document to have been fabricated by a Mr. Inch (leader of the Greyshirts in the Eastern Cape) and his accomplices in an attempt to discredit Jews.

The papers also contain correspondence between members of the Port Elizabeth Jewish community (in particular Mr. A. Schauder) and the South African Jewish Board of Deputies. It concerns the growing unease felt by the Jewish community in the face of the spread of the anti-Semitic campaign of the Greyshirts, and their concern at the South African Jewish Board of Deputies call for "no response"/ "silence" and to remain "lawful" in spite of the course of events.

The papers also contain documents and pamphlets (challenging the anti-Semitic propaganda circulated at the time), as well as photographs of the Schauder family.

SHOLEM SCHWARZBARD (1886 – 1938)

Jewish national hero. On May 25, 1926, in Paris in broad daylight, Sholem Schwarzbard, a Russian Jewish poet, and decorated French soldier from the First World War, shot and killed Simon Petlyura, the exiled Ukranian nationalist leader responsible for the pogroms against the Jews in the Ukranian villages during the Russian Civil War, 1919-1920. In his defence Schwarzbard, who had witnessed these atrocities, could only say, "I am a Jew." The incident caused a worldwide sensation. At the ensuing trial the tables were turned and Petlyura and his armies were condemned. In November 1927 Schwarzbard was acquitted thanks to the brilliant defence of his laywer, Henri Torres, and also to the support of world opinion and of eminent personalities, such as Henri Barbusse, Maxim Gorki, Romain Rolland, and Albert Einstein. Schwarzbard was acclaimed a hero by the Jewish and non-Jewish world.

In September 1937 Schwarzbard came to South Africa on behalf of the Yivo in Paris to sell the newly published Universal Yiddish Encyclopedia. In Cape Town on the 4th of February 1938, he met Hilda Purwitsky, a teacher and journalist, who was on the Cape Town committee of the Yiddish Encyclopedia, who was assigned to act as his secretary whilst he was in Cape Town. They formed a close friendship. He died suddenly of a heart attack at her cottage in Camps Bay on the night of the 3rd of March 1938. He was buried at Woltemade Jewish cemetery in Maitland in Cape Town. However in 1967 his remains were transferred to Kfar Avichayil, near Natanya in Israel, where he was reinterred with great ceremony as a national hero.

The material in this collection was assembled after Schwarzbard's death by Hilda Purwitsky. It is a memorial to her tireless efforts to have Schwarzbard's memory perpetuated. The collection contains some of Sholem Schwarzbard's original writings, several poems and two essays, which were translated into English by Hilda Purwitsky. The collection also contains Hilda's own recollections of Schwarzbard and five postcards written by Schwarzbard to Hilda. However the greater part of the collection consists of memorial tributes, press articles, and Hilda Purwitsky's correspondence after his death with amongst others, his widow, Anna in Paris, Faivl Zygielbaum, Yiddish author and friend of Schwarzbard in Johannesburg, Dr Joseph Bernfeld at the Yivo in Paris to which he left his books and papers, Dr Nedava, Professor of Political Science at Haifa University, who was hoping to write a book about Schwarzbard.

Hilda herself was keen to write a book about Schwarzbard, a project which she discussed with him and to which he was agreeable. In 1933 he had himself published an autobiography, *Inem loyf fun yorn* (As the years go by). However Hilda was anxious that his story should be more widely known in the English speaking world. After his death in 1939 she travelled to Paris to meet his widow, Anna, and worked with Dr Joseph Bernfeld at the Yivo sorting Schwarzbard's papers. The archival collection contains her outline for a biography together with many notes, extracts of press reports and letters received by Schwarzbard. She also translated fairly lengthy excerpts from his autobiography, and made extensive notes for the purpose of the biography.

Also found in the collection are numerous photographs of Schwarzbard, taken in France and in South Africa. The South African photographs include 21 portraits of Schwarzbard taken by the photographer, Henry Treisman, in Johannesburg.

Biographical note

Henry Katzew was born on in Johannesburg on 14 May 1912, one of 7 children to parents who had immigrated from Lithuania at the turn of the century.

He was educated at Forest High School. As a schoolboy, he submitted articles to the *Sunday Times*, some of which were accepted. After leaving school, he became, for a short period, a dispatch clerk for a firm of wholesale tobacconists, while continuing to submit sketches to the *Sunday Times*. In 1931 he was engaged as a cub reporter for the *Rand Daily Mail* and the *Sunday Times*. In 1933, he was transferred to run the *Mail* and *Sunday Times* office in Brakpan, where he stayed for 3 years.

In 1936, he left for England, hoping to make a career as a writer. He earned some money as a "space man" with the Press Association, working under the name of Henry Hornley. Together with a friend, Nat Soskin, he signed on as a deck boy on the "Jervis Bay" for a return voyage to Australia.

He returned to South Africa in 1938, after 2 years abroad and found employment at the Africopa News Agency until it dissolved in 1939.

He enlisted in March 1942, in the Seaward Defence Force (fore-runner of the South African Navy.

After he was demobilised in 1945, he wrote editorials and "viewpoint articles" for several South African newspapers For several of the newspapers, he wrote regular columns for many years, for instance, he wrote a regular *South African scene* column for the *Zionist Record*, under the pseudonym, Karl Lemeer. He also later wrote a regular column for the *Rand Daily Mail* and for the Sunday *Beeld*, with whose editor, Schalk Pienaar, he was friendly and who believed that readers should be exposed to a variety of opinions. In 1968 he became editor of the *Zionist Record*.

He moved with his family to a 5 acre property between Johannesburg and Vereeniging (in Grasmere) in 1951, where they lived for 13 years. It was intended that his sister-in-law would run it as a guest farm and he would write. The guest farm did not prove viable and he returned to full-time journalism.

He published two books, Solution for South Africa: a Jewish view (1956) Apartheid and survival (1965).

One of the themes that interested him and which he dealt with frequently in his writing was the place of the Afrikaner in South Africa. He looked to the state of Israel as a possible model, but in later years grew increasingly uneasy at political developments in both South Africa and Israel. For over 40 years, while expressing his own strongly-held opinions, he was also an important representation of the Jewish voice in the South African press.

In 1969, he and his wife left South Africa and went to Israel for 5 years, acting, while he was there, as foreign correspondent for *The Star*. After leaving Israel, they went to live in Rumson, New Jersey, with their daughter and son-in-law. He continued to act as a foreign correspondent for several South Africa newspapers. After 20 years in the U.S., they returned to South Africa in 1995.

In 1939, he had married Ethel Simon, a teacher, and they had three children, Michael, Helen and Tony Ivor.

BC1271 HILDA PURWITSKY / ROZA VAN GELDEREN PAPERS

This is the third collection of archival material donated to the Kaplan Centre for Jewish Studies by Hilda Purwitsky. The first two collections were donated during her life time, and focused on two of her great interests, South African art, and the life of the Jewish hero, Sholem Schwartzbard, respectively. The present collection was donated in 2000, two years after her death, by her nephew, Martin Bliden. It pertains to the Central Girls' School, where Hilda taught for 15 years, together with its headmistress, her dear friend and collaborator, Roza Van Gelderen. The collection reflects their work, writings, travels, and collections of art and artifacts.

A Dutch Jewess with dark gypsy looks, Roza Van Gelderen was dynamic, forceful and charismatic. On her father's side, her family was related to the great German poet, Heinrich Heine. Roza and Hilda became well known Cape Town personalities, as teachers, journalists, connoisseurs of the arts, and free spirits. They were close friends of the famous South African artist, Irma Stern, who painted their portraits.

Roza came to South Africa with her parents from Holland in 1897 at the age of seven. The family settled in Durban in Natal. They went back to Holland just before the Anglo-Boer War, only to return to Cape Town in 1903. Roza studied to be a teacher at the Teachers' Training College in Cape Town, qualifying in 1910. She worked as Kindergarten teacher in the Constitution Street Branch of the Hope Mill School (originally the Hebrew Public School), in District Six, and was appointed Headmistress in 1925. Hilda Purwitsky, who in addition to her basic teacher training, had a B.A. degree from the University of Cape Town, joined her at the school in 1925 [see BC 707 Purwitsky Collection for biographical information about Hilda].

Roza and Hilda had very individualistic and progressive ideas about the education of children, which they implemented in their school. Among their many innovations, they made the last two periods of the school day elective, giving the children a wide choice of subjects, instituting a children's newspaper, a Debating Club, and introducing lessons about sex, totally revolutionary in those days. Much emphasis was placed in the school on painting and drawing, culminating in the mounting of a Children's Art Exhibition.

The two taught at the school until 1940, when Roza was removed as headmistress, as the school was made co-educational. After this Roza and Hilda moved to Johannesburg, but later returned to Cape Town. With her fine appreciation of art and antiques, Roza was on occasion employed as a lecturer and advisor on antiques. The two amassed a valuable collection of African artifacts. Roza and Hilda travelled widely overseas, to the United Kingdom, Europe, Azerbadjan, Iran and Palestine (later Israel). All these interests are reflected in this collection, which contains scrapbooks and correspondence relating to the Central Girls' School, catalogues and Visitor's books of the Children's Art Exhibition, Roza and Hilda's writings both separately and together, under the pseudonym, Rozilda, catalogues of antiques and fine art, of their collection of African artifacts, and a large collection of black and white photographs, including personal portraits, travel, District Six in Cape Town, objects d'art, and African artifacts.

Schragenheim Papers BC 1305

These papers were donated by Julian Schragenheim, who immigrated to Johannesburg from Germany, in 1934, at the age of ten, together with his parents. His father managed to bring out his maternal grandparents in July 1939, but was unfortunately unable to rescue his paternal grandparents, who died in Berlin, in 1940 and 1941, respectively of natural causes, aggravated by lack of proper medical attention and starvation, as Jews were not allowed ration tickets. His aunt committed suicide just before the final roundup of the Jews in Berlin in 1942, rather than be deported by the Nazis. Julian Schragenheim lived in and around Johannesburg until 1995, when he and his wife moved to George. They came to Cape Town in 2005, when he donated this collection to the Kaplan Centre.

The papers include correspondence relating to his maternal grandfather, Siegmund Rosenbaum's business in Giessen, to the confiscation of his property by the National Socialist regime, and to his grandparents' emigration to South Africa. It also contains the nineteenth century handwritten Hebrew correspondence of his paternal great grandfather, Rabbi Dr Dov Baer Zomber (1821-1884), a famous rabbinic scholar, from Poland, who taught Talmud at the University in Wuerzberg, and at the *Bet-ha-Midrash* in Berlin (*Encyclopedia Judaica*, vol. 16 1972: 1219). The collection also includes copies of the original *Kongresszeitung*, the newspaper of the Twelfth Zionist Congress in Karlsbad, 7-20 August, 1922, which was attended by his grandfather.

BEN YOSEF PAPERS

Prof. Dr Israel Ben Yosef occupied the Isidore and Theresa Cohen Chair of Hebrew at the University of Cape Town between 1985 and 1989.

Born Israel Aharon Orenstein in Tiberius in Palestine in 1938, Israel changed his name to Ben Yosef to cut off all ties with the diaspora. He studied Hebrew literature and Jewish philosophy at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem where he obtained his B.A. and M.A degrees. He also served as a soldier in the 1956 and 1967 Israel-Arab Wars, and was decorated for bravery. He taught Hebrew literature in various High Schools and Teachers' academies in Israel.

In 1970 he left Israel for South Africa, where he served as Director for Student Matters at the South African Jewish Board of Deputies and the South African Zionist Federation in Johannesburg. In 1974 he received his D. Lit et Phil from UNISA, where from 1977 to1984 he lectured in the Semitics Department. At the same time he also served as a temporary rabbi at the Temple Hillel in Hillbrow and in the Liberal Congregation in Springs. In 1984 he was awarded a Harvard Fellowship for Religious Studies.

In 1986 he was appointed Professor in the Hebrew Department at the University of Cape Town where he taught until 1989. In 1990 he was appointed Rabbi of the Jewish Liberal Congregation, Or Chadash, in Zurich in Switzerland, and in 1991 he received his rabbinical ordination from the Leo Baeck College in London. He died on 4 February 1995 in Zurich.

Dr Ben Yosef published six books of poetry in Hebrew, three books of Hebrew poetry in English and Afrikaans translation, and an essay on Martin Buber and Adult education. His articles and sermons from his five year stint at the Liberal Congregation, Or Chadash, in Zurich, were collected and published after his death in two collections entitled, *Lebendiges Judentum*, by Erhard Roy Wiehn, in Germany in 1995.

His papers contain articles and clippings on South African rabbis, particularly those who served the Progressive Hebrew Congregations. It also contains articles and brochures relating to South African Jewry and Apartheid.

DUSCHINSKY PAPERS BC 1307

Rabbi Eugene Duschinsky came to South Africa from Hungary in 1945 at the age of 33. He was educated in Hungary, Czechoslovakia, England and the United States. He received his Rabbinical Diploma in Pressburg and an M.A. from the Yeshiva University in New York.

He served as Rabbi to the Country Communities, and as Av Beth Din, the Head of the Rabbinical Court of the Union of Orthodox Hebrew Congregations in Cape Town. In 1968 he was appointed Rabbi of the Schoonder Street Synagogue in Cape Town, where he served until 1985, when he emigrated to Israel. He is the author of several publications, published in Budapest, New York, and Israel. This small collection of his papers was presented to the Kaplan Centre for Jewish Studies and Research by Colin Robinson, former teacher at Herzlia Weizman Primary School, currently resident in Jerusalem. It consists of correspondence, 1975-1976, and notes on the weekly Torah portion in Hebrew.

BC 1308 OROLOWITZ/ SOLOMON FAMILY PAPERS

This collection was donated to the Kaplan Centre by Cyril Orolowitz (1933-2006) in October 2003. Cyril Orolowitz was born in Paarl in the Western Cape. His parents, Louise and Solly Orolowitz, came to South Africa as immigrants from eastern Europe. This large collection is the product of Cyril's attempt to compile a family tree for his large extended family.

Cyril's family is very typical of the eastern European Jewish families that make up eighty percent of the Jewish community in South Africa. His father's family immigrated to South Africa at the turn of the nineteenth century, at a time when eastern European Jewish immigration was at its peak. One of the earliest arrivals, the trooper, Joseph Rabie, was killed in the South African War in 1901. Cyril Orolowitz's mother, who was orphaned in the Ukraine in the aftermath of the Russian Revolution of 1917, immigrated to South Africa after being refused entry to the United States due to the Immigration Quota.

The collection contains photographs, identity documents, memorabilia, research files, correspondence, including a collection of early 19th century Jewish postcards from eastern Europe and the United Kingdom, as well as video and audiotapes of typical Jewish celebrations - weddings, a *bris* (circumcision), a *barmitzvah*, *chazones* (cantorial singing), as well as of Cyril's trips to Lithuania to search for the roots of his family.

The collection also contains records of a distant family relative, Ben Moreell (1892-1978), a much decorated Admiral in the United State Navy, who is buried in Arlington Cemetery in Washington. Moreell is a descendant from the first marriage of Cyril Orolowitz's great great grandmother. While Moreell's family converted to Christianity in the United States, ironically his grandfather, Judah Loeb Sossnitz, was a noted rabbinic scholar, who is documented in the *Jewish Encyclopaedia*.

Isaac Ochberg, Cape Town philanthropist, born in Uman in the Ukraine in 1878, who came to South Africa in 1895, and made a fortune from various business ventures, including property speculation, building projects, shipping, farming and scrap-metal dealings, died in 1937. His vast estate was divided between his widow, Pauline, siblings, and children, with large awards to numerous charities in South Africa and in Israel. Max Raysman Papers BC 1341

This collection of papers from Max Raysman (1913-2007) came to Manuscripts and Archives via the Kaplan Centre for Jewish Studies and Research in 2007. It was originally donated to the Gitlin Library of the Western Province Zionist Council, who passed it on to the Jewish Studies Library. Max Raysman emigrated to South Africa from Kovno in Lithuania in 1929 at the age of 16. An engraver by profession, Max always retained a love for his mother tongue, Yiddish, reading Yiddish books and participating in Yiddish theatre in Cape Town. His papers include personal correspondence, three scrapbooks of newspaper cuttings in Yiddish and English relating to local and international Jewish affairs, a scrapbook on Yiddish theatre in South Africa, and programmes of his brother, who under the stage name of Alexis Rassine, danced with the Sadlers Wells ballet company. The collection also includes books and pamphlets, reflecting his interests in the former Soviet Union and in the State of Israel.

Isaacs Family Papers BC 1342

The Rev. Harris Isaacs was born in Poland in 1861. It is not known exactly when he immigrated to London, but between 1886 and 1889 he served as minister, lecturer, Reader, and Head teacher at the South Hackney Synagogue in London. He emigrated to South Africa after 1890, and from approximately 1893 to 1896, he served as minister of the Johannesburg Hebrew Congregation, the congregation that broke away from the original Witwatersrand Hebrew Congregation, founded in 1887. Rev. Isaacs became a naturalized British subject in the Cape of Good Hope in 1901. In 1904 he was granted a permit to enter and reside in the Transvaal and Orange River Colony. He served as the minister to the Kimberley Hebrew Congregation until his retirement due to ill health in 1927, when he went to live in Muizenberg. He died on 14 July 1935.

Rev. Isaacs' son, Philip Isaacs, born in 1906, was the longest serving pharmacist in Cape Town. Isaacs opened his pharmacy on the Camps Bay beach front in 1931. He was still practicing in the year 2000, keeping the pharmacy open seven days a week. He retired in 2002 at the age of 96, and died three years later, in August 2005, when the pharmacy building was put up for auction.

BEINKINSTADT COLLECTION BC 1378

This collection was acquired in July 2008, when M. Beinkinstadt (established 1903), the earliest and longest single family owned Jewish bookstore in South Africa, closed down. The collection was donated by Michael Padovich, the current owner, and grandson of Moshe Beinkinstadt. The archival collection was received as part of a larger donation of approximately 1800 Hebrew and Yiddish books, of which about 70 were selected by the Jewish Studies Library. Most of the remaining Yiddish books were sent to the National Yiddish Book Centre in Amherst, Massachusetts, U.S.A..

The archival collection consists of 100 leather bound letter books (1904-1942), one ledger (1947-1952), and a miscellany of exemplars of the shop's stationery and letterheads. The letter books contain copies of correspondence with overseas suppliers, in Russia, Latvia, Germany, Palestine, London and the United States, and with customers, who are located all over South Africa as well as the former Southern Rhodesia. By far the greater proportion of the letters are written in Yiddish, but in the earliest books there is also a fair amount of correspondence in Russian.

Until the mid 1920s M. Beinkinstadt Bookseller was located at number 76 Caledon Street. Some time between 1922 and 1927 they moved to 38 Canterbury Street. Besides Jewish liturgical and legal works, M. Beinkinstadt imported all the basic religious requirements, such as *taleysim* (prayer shawls), *tsitsit* (prayer vest), *tefilin* (phylacteries), and *mezuzas*, that were imported originally from M. Katzenellenbogen in Vilna. From the outset Beinkinstadt also imported secular books in Yiddish, both for purchase and for circulation. The earliest property stamp found in the letter books, describes the business as:

M. Beinkinstadt Hebrew Books, Stationery Circulating Library Street Box Cape Town

Found among the stationery are advertisements or flyers for the first Yiddish book ever published in South Africa: Nehemiah Dov Baer Hoffman's Sefer ha-Zikhroynes (1916); the Hebrew Encyclopedia, Otsar Yisrael; Heinrich Graetz' History of the Jews and Nahum Sokolov's History of Zionism. Beinkinstadt also produced catalogues of the Six-Penny Library of English and World Famous Classics, that included a Yiddish section that listed 271 titles from the Groshn Bibliotek series that was published in Warsaw in the 1930s.

In 1910 Beinkinstadt took over the City Printing Works, of 117 Bree Street, and were offering services "for all kinds of Printing, Bookbinding and Kindred Lines". At about this time they also started importing kosher foodstuffs, and advertised themselves as "Beinkinstadt's Cape Town Kosher, Matzos & Grocery Store."

THE SOUTH AFRICAN HEBREW DIVIDING BENEFIT SOCIETY BC 1384

BELLA SANDERS PAPERS BC 1426

This collection of 37 letters was donated to Manuscripts and Archives via the Kaplan Centre for Jewish Studies and Research, by Derrick Lewis in 2009. The letters were written to his grandmother, Bella Israelsohn (Sanders, 1875-1968), who was living in Oudtshoorn between 1893 and 1937. Her parents had emigrated from Latvia to South Africa in 1882. The letters are from Bella's brother, Lazarus, who was working for the departmental store of Cleghorn Harris in Cape Town and in Port Elizabeth; and also from her girlfriends who were living in Kimberley, Calvinia and Uniondale. They provide interesting insights into how young people amused themselves in those days, with visits to the theatre, balls and dances, music and amateur theatricals, contrasting life in the small towns and the cities of South Africa. There is passing mention of Jewish festivals and of the South African War; one letter mentions the celebration of "The Relief of Ladysmith" in Uniondale.

BC 1427 LOUIS MIRVISH PAPERS

Louis Mirvish (ca. 1897-1960) was born in Lithuania. He was one of the first two medical graduates of the University of Cape Town, taking his degrees in medicine and surgery in 1922. He lectured in physiology at UCT until 1929 before doing postgraduate studies in London, Berlin and Vienna. He returned to South Africa in 1932 and practised as a physician in Cape Town. He became head of the Department of Gastro-enterology at Groote Schuur Hospital.

He was very involved in Jewish and cultural affairs, in particular, the South African Jewish Museum, which he was instrumental in establishing.

MARCIA GITLIN PAPERS BC 1458

Marcia Gitlin (b. 1909), was one of the five children of Jacob Gitlin, the leading exponent of Zionism in Cape Town, after whom the Jacob Gitlin Library of the Western Province Zionist Federation, Cape Council, is named. From 1931 she served as editor of the *S. A. Jewish Chronicle*, and in 1933, she was one of the first young South African Jewish women to visit Palestine. From 1938 until her emigration to Jerusalem in Palestine in 1946, she served as sub-editor of *The Zionist Record* in Johannesburg. She was present during the siege of Jerusalem in 1948, that she chronicled in letters to her father. She is the author of *Vision Amazing: the Story of South African Zionism* the first history of South African Zionism, published in 1950.

This collection was donated to Manuscripts and Archives via the Kaplan Centre for Jewish Studies and Research. It was transferred from the Jacob Gitlin Library via John Simon in 2010.

PINCHAS GUTTER PAPERS BC 1490

Pinchas Gutter is a Holocaust survivor who immigrated to South Africa. Born in Lodz in Poland, with the outbreak of World War II, his family moved to Warsaw. He and his family were incarcerated in the Warsaw Ghetto for three years after which they were deported to Majdanek concentration camp where his entire family was murdered. On liberation Pinchas was sent to Britain along with other children to be rehabilitated. He lived for many years in South Africa. In 1985 he emigrated to Toronto in Canada. Whilst living in South Africa he was active in various Jewish welfare organisations particularly relating to the care of the aged. These few files reflect his involvement with Highlands House, the Cape Jewish Seniors and the Holocaust Centre, amongst others.

Biographical information:

Joel Isidore Mann (1874-1936), Lithuanian born Jewish entrepreneur who left for South Africa. He arrived in Johannesburg and following that settled in Ladismith in the Klein Karoo. He was a successful ostrich farmer and built a beautiful residence in Ladismith know as one of the "feather palaces" of South Africa. He was a member of the Cape Provincial Council and Mayor of Ladismith for a period. He paid for the Ladismith synagogue from his own funds. His stationary reads "Farmer, Broker & Feather Buyer."

Nathan Mann (Joel's son) had a career in municipal politics in Johannesburg, joining the United Party. Joel's daughter Emily Myer was the first Jewish woman to hold the title of mayor in Boksburg in the Eastern Transvaal (now Gauteng)

The Mann family hold an impressive generational record in public political service.
